#### 2. Remarks of the Co-Chair and Academic Co-Chair

#### 4. Embedded Certificate in Pluralism and Global Citizenship

Documentation for this item was circulated with the Agenda. Melissa Boyce and Virginia Tumasz presented this item.

## Highlights:

- The proponents provided an overview of the proposal to create an embedded certificate in Pluralism and Global Citizenship, reported that the goal is to provide a program that will result in students developing an understanding of and respect for diversity and globalism, and noted that this ties well with the priorities set out in institutional plans such as the Academic Plan, Global Engagement Plan, and Experiential Learning Plan
- In response to questions, it was reported that:
  - Travel is not a requirement to complete the certificate
  - Two required courses will bookend the certificate, an introductory course and a capstone course, and all students will meet the learning outcomes of the program no matter which optional courses they pursue
  - The two required courses will be taught by faculty members not sessionals
  - It is intended to expand beyond the embedded certificate to create a collaborative undergraduate degree program in the future, but the creation of an embedded certificate for graduate students is not being contemplated at this time
  - The course list does include junior and senior courses, and this is considered to be fine because the intention is to ensure that students are taking courses that will expand their horizons
  - The course list will evolve over time
  - Students will have to register in the certificate before they can take the capstone course, but can take courses to use toward the certificate prior to registering in it. Students typically have some courses toward a certificate prior to registering.
  - There will be a program coordinator who will be available to advise students
  - A student's home Faculty is responsible for the course check prior to graduation

# Moved/Seconded

That the Academic Program Subcommittee recommend that the Academic Planning and Priorities Committee approve the creation of an embedded certificate in Pluralism and Global Citizenship, effective August 15, 2021, as set out in the proposal provided to the Committee.
