1. Approval of the Agenda

2. <u>Remarks of the Co-Chair and Academic Co-Chair</u>

The Co-Chair updated the Committee members on the University's monitoring of the new Covid variant and the ongoing discussions around the potential impacts it may have on exams, and the Winter 2022 term and encouraged members to watch for updates as they become available.

The Academic Co-Chair made no remarks.

3. Approval of the November 18, 2021 Calendar and Curriculum Subcommittee Meeting Minutes

4. <u>Recommendation of Changes to Academic Regulations Section F.1.3 Flexible Grade Option</u> (CG Grade)

Documentation for this item was circulated with the Agenda. Mary O'Brien, Associate Dean (Policy and Program Development), Faculty of Graduate Studies, presented this item.

Highlights:

- The proponent provided a summary of the changes to the Flexible Grade Option regulation, which would allow the use of Credit Granted (CG) grades for certain graduate courses. The proponent reported that the use of a CG grade will be limited to a maximum of 3 units over the course of a graduate program and a comprehensive list of courses eligible for a CG grade will be provided once the courses have been determined.
- The Committee recommended that:
 - The entry be organized to make it clear which section(s) of the CG regulations apply to both undergraduate and graduate courses
 - The following sentence be removed 'Students who have a final grade after an academic misconduct ruling are not eligible for the CG option.' as there is already a section relating to academic misconduct in the regulations

5. <u>Changes to Undergraduate Admission Requirements Section A.5.6.2 Indigenous Admission</u> <u>Supplementary Process</u>

Documentation for this item was circulated with the Agenda. Amy Dambrowitz, Registrar, presented this item.

Highlights:

- The proponent provided a summary of the changes to the *Indigenous Admission Supplementary Process* section of the Calendar, which include the addition of the Schulich School of Engineering (SSE) Bridging Pathway program, that was recently approved by the Academic Planning and Priorities Committee. The proponent reported that a communications plan is being developed to promote the bridging programs that are available across the University.

6. <u>Calendar Changes for the Cumming School of Medicine</u>

Documentation for this item was circulated with the Agenda. Ebba Kurz, Associate Dean Undergraduate Health & Science Education, Cumming School of Medicine, presented this item.

Highlights:

- The proponent provided a summary of the changes, which include editorial changes to Faculty and program information, course descriptions, course deletions, reorganization of sections, clarification on progression requirements and updates to immunization and N95 mask fit-testing language
- The Committee recommended that:
 - \circ $\;$ The clerkship electives course hours be revised to state 16 weeks
 - The links in section 5.8 *Assessment*, be updated
 - The term 'Indigenous' be consistently capitalized and that the phrase 'Indigenous ancestry' be replaced with 'Indigenous identity'

7. <u>Calendar Changes for the Faculty of Nursing</u>

Documentation for this item was circulated with the Agenda. Catherine Laing, Associate Dean, Undergraduate Programs, Faculty of Nursing, presented this item.

Highlights:

- The proponent provided a summary of the changes, which include expanding accepted courses for admission requirements in the Transfer and Degree-Holder routes, clarifying the admissions process for applicants who are currently enrolled or were previously enrolled in a Nursing program, updated immunization requirements and the addition of the Academic Turnaround Program (ATP)
- In response to a question, it was explained that Alberta Health Services (AHS) sites require specific immunizations and that there are currently no AHS exemptions for Covid vaccines
- The Committee recommended that:
 - The Faculty consider stating the eligibility requirements for students to enter into the ATP, such as participation in the ATP is only permitted once, or any additional requirements
 - The Faculty of Nursing should be added to the list of participating Faculties in section B.18 Academic Turnaround Program (ATP) of the University Calendar
 - Revisions be made to the language for the immunization requirements to state that students who do not meeting specific immunization requirements will be unable to progress in their program

- The proponent provided a summary of the changes, which include updates to Faculty sections and regulations; the addition of the honours program across all Bachelor of Education (BEd) pathways, course additions and other minor editorial changes
- The Committee recommended that:
 - The admissions requirements for the BEd (Honours) remove reference to 'Fall term preceding desired intake' for the calculation of GPA as students may have courses in the Spring term that would be part of the 30 recently completed units and remove 'Students on academic probation are not eligible for the BEd (Honours) program'
 - The use of combined versus concurrent language be reviewed for consistency and provide distinction between the two if needed
 - The term 'Indigenous' be consistently capitalized
