The Co-Chair called the meeting to order at 2:03 p.m. and confirmed quorum.

1. Approval of the Agenda

The Agenda for the May 30, 2017 Research and Scholarship Committee meeting was approved by consensus.

2. Remarks of the Co-Chair

The Co-Chair included the following in his remarks:

- Tina Miller, Students' Union representative, was welcomed to her first Research and Scholarship Committee meeting
- Nancy Arthur, Werklund School of Education, has been re-appointed as the Academic Co-Chair of the Committee for a two year term
- Members of the University community have had recent funding successes, such as a number of Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council (NSERC) Discovery Grants
- The University has submitted two applications to the current Canada First Research Excellence Fund (CFREF) competition. The results should be known in approximately six months.
- The results of the 2017 Canada Foundation for Innovation (CFI) Innovation Fund competition will be announced in June 2017
- The University's Research Management System will pilot a grant application submission module this Fall, and then the module will be available widely in the Spring. A publications module is in development and may be available in 2019.
- A joint meeting of the Committee and the Associate Deans Research Council (ADRC) will be hosted
 by the office of the Vice-President (Research) on June 19, 2017, and an invitation will be sent to
 the members of the Committee soon. Topics for discussion at the meeting will be the Naylor
 Report on federal funding for fundamental science and the recent changes to the Post-Secondary
 Learning Act with respect to labour relations.

The Vice-Provost (Libraries and Cultural Resources) and University Librarian reported that the University has applied for an ORCID iD institutional account, which will provide access to a system that generates a unique identifier for a researcher and allows the researcher to link to their publications and professional activities. This will improve the annual reporting process.

A member of the Committee remarked that the requirement for the University to be in compliance with the General Data Protection Regulation goes into force on May 25, 2018. The regulation protects the personal data of Europeans, and extends to all foreign entities processing the data of Europeans.

3. Approval of the April 25, 2017 Minutes

4. Comprehensive Institutional Plan Appendix C: Research, Applied Research, and Scholarly Activities

Documentation for this item was circulated with the Agenda. Ed McCauley, Vice-President (Research), presented this item.

Highlights:

- The proponent reminded the Committee that the Comprehensive Institutional Plan (CIP)
 Appendix C: Research, Applied Research, and Scholarly Activities is in a different format this year
 and has prescribed content, and reported that the feedback and suggestions given by the
 Committee at the April 25, 2017 meeting have been considered and incorporated in the document
 where appropriate
- The Committee discussed the document, including how it relates to the University's Academic Plan (AP) and Strategic Research Plan (SRP), and expressed overall satisfaction with the document
- In response to a question, the proponent indicated that the AP and SRP are currently being renewed, and therefore care was taken not to be too specific in the CIP Appendix C about future institutional research priorities

Highlights:

- The Committee discussed that:
 - o While all of the responsibilities in its Terms of Reference appear appropriate, the Committee's work over this year has not included some of the listed responsibilities
 - When the Committee develops its 2017-2018 work plan in the Fall, the Terms of Reference will be referred to
 - The business of the Committee overlaps with that of the ADRC, but the Committee holds strong discussions, contributes formally and meaningfully to the research enterprise, and serves to disseminate important information relating to research
- The Committee brainstormed ways to identify agenda items, such has holding round-table sessions at each meeting during which members could share current research-related initiatives in their Faculties or raise topics of interest, or inviting Deans or Associate Deans to present to the Committee on their Faculty's research strengths
